

Parks and gardens

Whether you're packing a picnic or looking for somewhere to let the kids run free, we know just the place...

Located in Albury's main street, the Albury Botanic Gardens have enchanted visitors for over 130 years. The Children's Garden within is always a popular visit, with life-sized dinosaurs, a fairy temple, troll's cave and lots of activities to spark the imagination.

You'll also find fun playgrounds along the banks of the Murray at Oddies Creek Park, a short walk from Noreuil Park. Grab a coffee and enjoy a stroll under a tree-lined canopy by the river.

Belvoir Park

Walk or run around the lake; let the dogs off the leash; fire up the barbecue. The open spaces of Belvoir Park in Wodonga keep everyone entertained, especially little ones with an epic playground including an accessible liberty swing.

Surrounding towns

Base yourself in Albury Wodonga and explore wine country, the high country and many charming country towns in between.

Meander north to the village of Holbrook and check out the giant submarine that takes pride of place in the main street! On your way back, stop in at Jindera Pioneer Museum, built around an existing 1847 general store, homes, grounds and machinery sheds.

Or hug the gentle bends of the river with a day drive to the final resting place of 'The Man from Snowy River' at Corryong. You'll pass by impressive sculptures along the road and the gigantic monolith, Pine Mountain, around 1.5 times bigger than Uluru.

Historic drives

Wander the picturesque streets of Beechworth to find Beechworth Honey, Old Beechworth Gaol and a host of heritage and foodie destinations. You'll find more tasty treats alongside arts and crafts at nearby Yackandandah, plus antique shopping in delightful Chiltern.

Shopping

From fresh food markets to quality boutiques and hidden treasures, the local retail scene has you covered.

Lose yourself in the eclectic shopping scene of Albury Wodonga's laneways, full of boutique goodness and a major brand or two! Don't miss Di Billet and Zeinert and Co for a gorgeous selection of homewares, fashion and gifts.

Home chefs should also make their way to The Essential Ingredient, and to Harris Farm Markets where you can sip bubbly and pick fresh produce under one roof.

Farmers Market
Every Saturday morning, the Albury Wodonga Farmers Market takes over Gateway Village. It's the perfect place to fill your picnic basket with local produce, crusty bread, sweet treats and other delicious seasonal goodies.

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

The Mighty Murray

Much more than a state border, the Murray River draws people to picnic and play.

At Noreuil Park you'll find shady trees overlooking lawns by the banks of the river, as well as barbecues, playgrounds for the kids, plus places to hire a kayak if you feel like hitting the water.

Join the locals for some fishing, swimming, canoeing or just drifting along with the current. To stay as close as possible to the water, there's free riverside camping at Richardson's Bend.

Riverside walks

The Wagirra Trail provides the ideal riverside setting for long walks by the banks of the Murray River. You'll soon know when you've hit the Yindamarra Sculpture Walk, featuring striking sculptures by local indigenous artists.

Living history

As a natural meeting place, Albury Wodonga has many stories to share and sites to see.

Visit the iconic War Memorial overlooking Albury atop Monument Hill, the always interesting LibraryMuseum, and the extensive Bandiana Army Museum.

Download the Albury CBD Historic Walking Tour app and take yourself on a self-guided trip through the city's grand historic buildings and landmarks. It's a fascinating insight into Albury's social, political and economic past.

Bonegilla Migrant Experience

One in 20 Australians have links to Bonegilla, and the Bonegilla Migrant Experience brings their stories to life.

Walk through the site's remaining historic buildings and learn what life was like for the post-war migrants who came through here on their way to a new future in a new country.



Pubs and bars

Pull up a stool! Whatever your tipple of choice, there's a place to raise a glass.

As well as thriving pubs and clubs, take your pick from Two Fingers, a specialist whiskey bar full of personality, or Temperance and General, a boutique laneway cocktail bar well worth discovering.

Across the cities, there's an epic selection of craft beers flowing, and wine lovers can experience everything from our regional faves to imported treasures at wine bars and restaurants.



Lake Hume

This photogenic landmark is also a popular aquatic playground.

From the awe-inspiring dam wall to the waters of Lake Hume itself (six times the volume of Sydney Harbour), this iconic location is an easy 15 minutes from town.

For the adventurous, there's wakeboarding, water-skiing, tube-riding and stand-up paddleboarding. For a gentler pace, the foreshore has plenty of places to set up a picnic, fire up a barbecue, and enjoy the scenery of undulating hillsides around the lake.

Throw in a line

With plenty of boat ramps and great bank access, anglers have been casting off at Lake Hume for generations. Grab yourself a Victorian fishing licence and try your luck at hooking local specialties such as Trout, Redfin and Golden Perch – or chase a famous Murray Cod in season.



Tracks and trails

There are 90 kilometres of tracks and trails to discover.

Nail Can Hill features spectacular views from a network of trails ideal for bush walks, running and mountain bike riding.

There's more native flora and fauna at McFarlanes Hill to discover, where walking tracks take you over rolling hills and alongside clear streams.



High Country Rail Trail

Pack your bike for one of Victoria's most picturesque Rail Trails, skirting the foreshore of Lake Hume for 30 kilometres. Take a break at the Insta-worthy Sandy Creek Bridge and viewing platform.



Local dining

At the centre of an abundant food bowl, Albury Wodonga's eateries deliver delicious dining options that cater to every taste.

From a simple wood-fired pizza to a choice of three chef's hatted restaurants, you'll find we take our food here very seriously. Creative and passionate chefs serve up magic dishes from locally sourced produce every day.
